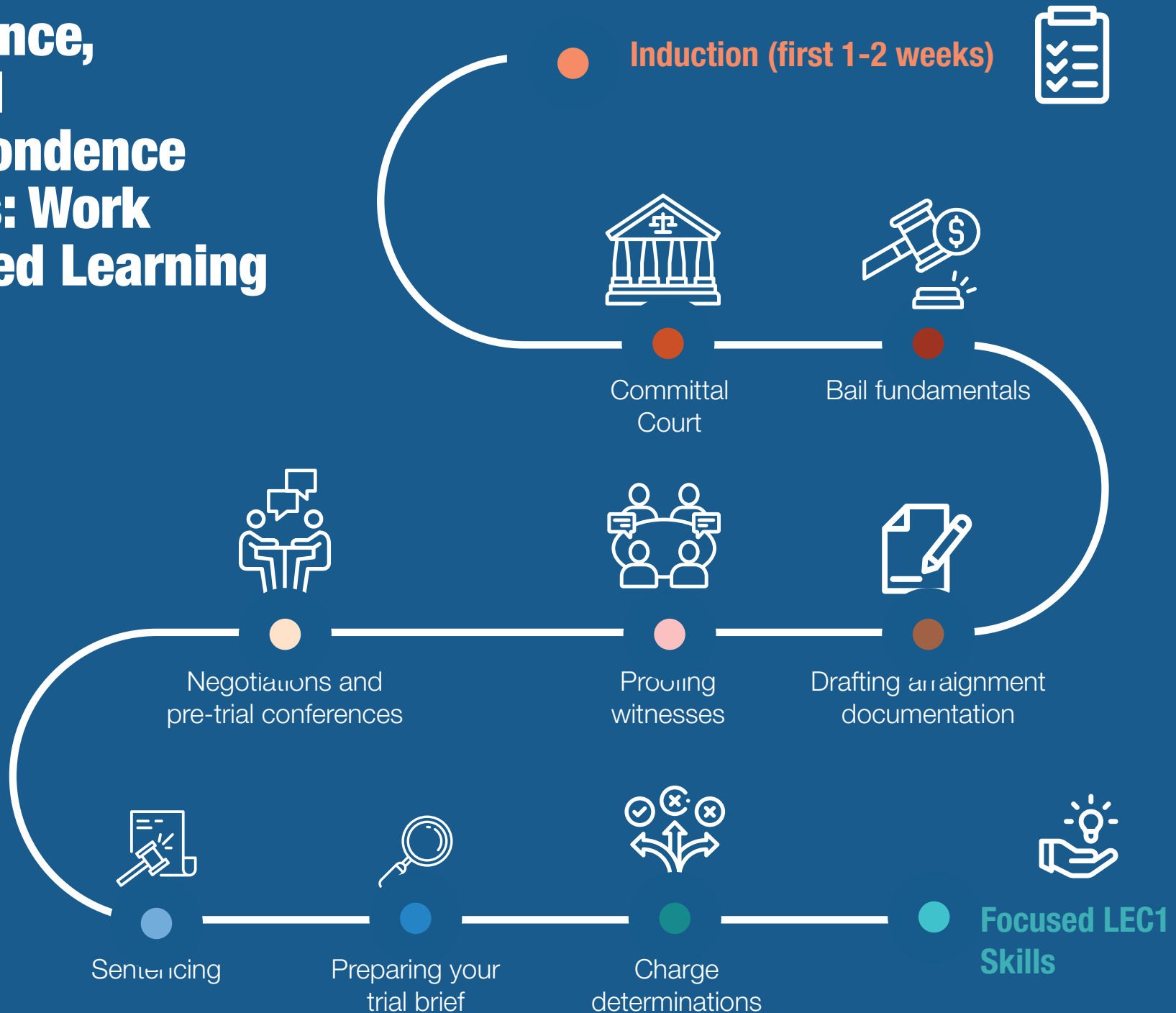
In depth modules designed to support your progression towards litigious hearings such as disputed facts hearings and *voir-dires*.
